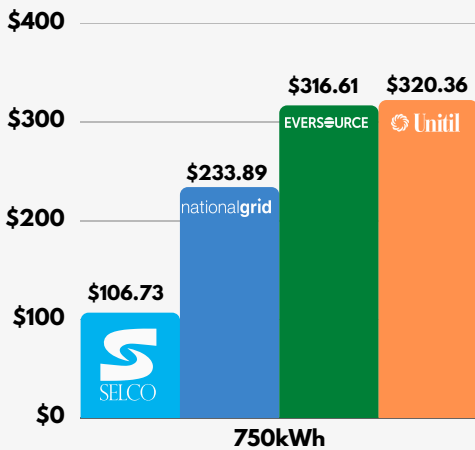

ELECTRIC RATE COMPARISON AS OF OCTOBER 1, 2023

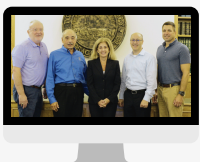
(750 kWh monthly, includes all customer charges)

THAT'S A WRAP!

We are pleased to announce that in partnership with the Shrewsbury Cultural Council, five (5) electrical boxes have been wrapped around Shrewsbury with original artwork from local artists. Be sure to check them out around town!



You may have noticed vaults, switches, transformers and junction boxes – sometimes called green utilities boxes – in your neighborhood or your own front yard. These boxes house high voltage utility equipment and connect our homes to electricity.

Cared for properly, utilities boxes are completely safe. The danger occurs if boxes are tampered with or blocked by landscaping. It's important that boxes are free of materials and objects that prevent ventilation. They need air to keep them cool and working properly, otherwise they can become a fire hazard.

MOR-EV REBATE EXPANSION

Massachusetts recently expanded the MOR-EV rebate program to include

- \$3500 rebates for used EV's for income qualifying residents
- \$1500 rebate adders for income qualifying residents
- Increased rebates for certain light-duty pickup trucks
- The launch of rebates at point-of-sale with participating dealers

BATTERY REBATE

Interested in energy storage on its own or paired with solar panels? Rebates are available for residential behind-the-meter battery systems.



Rebate: \$100/kWh

Residential batteries can be paired with solar panels to store excess energy generated by the panels during the day for later use after sunset. Residential batteries can also provide back-up for critical loads in the home, like refrigerators and sump pumps, in case of a power outage. Eligible brands include Sonnen or Generac PWRCell brands that have a minimum storage capacity of 7.5 kilowatt-hours (kWh).

Eligibility for the rebate requires enrollment in the Connected Homes program where additional incentives of \$30/month for participation in peak events are available.
